Mary Gillespie Memorial Achievement Award

This award was created in 1996 by the Alumni chapter, in memory of 'The Chief' Mary Gillespie who served the active chapter as House Mother for over 30 years, and who passed away in 1994 at the age of 108. The purpose of the award is to provide financial assistance to a Theta Active member who exemplifies fraternal involvement, scholastic achievement and financial need. The award was presented at the Fraternity Formal – Shaun Hodgins was the successful recipient. The monetary funds for the award are generated from the accruing interest on a GIC managed by the Alumni Chapter

Abe Lighthall Memorial Bursary

The Lighthall Memorial Bursary is a \$150 annual award that has been funded by our chapter since the early 1970's. The award is in the memory of Abe Lighthall, a member of the Department of Civil Engineering from 1920 to 1945, who played a significant role in the development of Sigma Phi

Delta. The bursary is presented by U.B.C. to a male engineering undergraduate student of the university. The primary criterion for obtaining the award is the applicant's financial need; scholastic standing is also considered.

At the time of the last Alumni Newsletter, the proposal was to create a self-perpetuating bursary that would also require extra-curricular involvement in the criteria. This proposal failed in the UBC senate vote, and it was decided that to meet the Senate requirements was not in the spirit of the bursary. The Nemetz Foundation, run by Alumnus Alvin Nemetz, has since funded this bursary on an annual basis at the existing rate of \$150.

Treasurer's Report - Alumni Chapter Finances

In light of annual fluctuations in cash flow to meet basic operating costs (approximately \$500/yr. to \$700/yr.), the Alumni Executive has adopted the following policy change:

All donations received by the Vancouver Alumni Chapter of Sigma Phi Delta Fraternity will be placed in a Term Investment from which a portion of the interest accrued will be used to fund basic operating costs.

This policy changed should prevent future emergency calls for donations. In addition, the Alumni Executive is proceeding with an application for not-for-profit charity status which would allow for the issuance of tax receipts for all donations. At this point I would invite any Alumni with experience to offer in this matter, please contact me at your convenience.

Active Chapter

Theta chapter has continued to make renovations and upkeep of the chapter house a priority among both Actives and Alumni. Brother Adam Niiranen is the current Active House Manager, and recently coordinated a well-attended work party which resulted in the completion of many important projects including a new pantry, as well as general upkeep.

Brother Martin Froehling is the Alumni House Liaison, and has worked with Adam to set up a roof-fund project, which is intended to provide the funds necessary to replace the chapter house roof in 6-9 years. Rent has been increased by approximately \$25 per tenant, with the increase being deposited directly into a low-risk mutual fund where it can accrue interest over several years. As the replacement time for the roof nears, the fund will be transferred strategically into a stable, liquid account.

As always, donations toward repair and upkeep of the chapter house are greatly appreciated. It is through the combination of generous donations by caring Alumni and monthly rent paid by resident Actives that the house is maintained properly. The Actives and Alumni Executive are always happy to discuss specific projects that donating members would like to see accomplished, and we encourage your participation!

The fwat house is still located at 4586 West 6th Avenue. Feel free to drop in on active chapter meetings on Wednesdays from 7:30 p.m.
