Back to Basics: Beer, Ale & Lager (A slanted opinion by KEGGER!!!)

Has anyone every posed the question "If you could only have one thing to drink for the rest of your life, what would it be?" This is a no-brainer for me. BEER. But having thought this through one more step it would have to be ale? Ale you ask? Well here's a little background

Beers fall into two broad categories: Those that are produced by top-fermenting yeasts (ales) and those that are made with bottom-fermenting yeasts (lagers). There are hybrids, but that's another discussion. I'm going to explain why ale is the better choice over lager.

I'm going to use just two points to prove my position. The number of choices with each beer in their traditional forms (excluding seasonal beers and the hybrids that may cloud our judgment) and the temperature that you drink them at.

Lets start with choices. With a Lager type of beer, you have the obvious lager and it's long-standing and world-renowned pilsner. This is ignoring specialties/seasonals like bocks and dopplebocks, Maerzens/Oktoberfests, Dortmunders and a few other styles found mostly in Germany.

Pilsner is a clear, golden lager with a dry but soft malty taste and flowery hop aroma and lager is a beer that is attenuated, cleaner, rounder but arguably less complexity than is found in ales. Unfortunately, every North American lager is shooting for the same thing. Boring.....

One could mention Light beer, with it's higher water to grain ratio and Ice beer, that allows ice crystals to form

and then the ice is filtered out but these are just mundane lagers like the rest.

Basically, there are only 2 types of lagers. After a while one might get bored of only two choices.

Now lets talk about ales. There are the many types of ales that are produced to a wide variety of colours, palates and strengths. They include everything with ale in the name. Pale ale, Brown ale, Amber ale, Cream ale, Bitter ale, Mild ale, India Pale Ale, Light Ale, Old Ale, Scotch Ale, etc., including Porter and Stout dark ales. They generally have a more robust taste and are more complex. They can have nutty, fruity and/or hoppy overtones and range from sweet to dry (lacking any sweetness). With all these choices, I know I never would get bored.

Let's move to temperature.

Lagers are best consumed at a cooler temperature. For most people below 10C is appropriate, although anything served at less than 38F/3C will lose most of its flavour. This means that as lager warm up they don't get any better tasting. Lagers are usually thought of as crisp with little to no aftertaste, but warm them up and the aftertaste becomes more pronounced. This is usually not a good thing.

Ales generally have a more robust taste, are more complex and are best consumed cool (50F/10C or a bit warmer) rather than cold. With the extra complexities, ales flavours only become more pronounced as it warms up. These flavours are a good thing and the reason I like to drink them.

So to summarize, my two points were that lagers only come in 2 types (leaving out specialties/seasonals) and ales come in a large variety. Secondly, ales can be drank at warmer temperatures than lagers. This allows one to pour a really big mug of ale and not have to worry as much about it warming a little before you drink it.

You@SigPhi.ca!

The Vancouver Alumni association has acquired a domain! SigPhi.ca will be used for personal email aliasing, Fraternity email lists, and webpage hosting. Email addresses (and perhaps eventually web space) on this domain will be made available to Active and Alumni members.

For years, I've wanted a Frat email address that would stay static for life; unfortunately this vision was restricted by the financial limitation of hosting a mail server on a static IP address. New software has come out that lets us bind a static domain name to a dynamic IP address; using this service, we have been able to assign this SigPhi.ca domain name to the House's ADSL connection.

Nothing is carved in stone yet, but we are thinking that email addresses will be assigned on the following guidelines:

- Two aliases can be assigned per person; a proper name (e.g. JBreadner@SigPhi.ca) and a nickname (e.g. Worf@SigPhi.ca). Conflicts will be dealt with on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Email lists for Actives and Alumni will be created and maintained by the mail sysop. Examples of lists are: Alumni@, Actives@, Pledges@, SoccerTeam@, and ClassOf1995@SigPhi.ca. Any reasonable list will be considered.
- Aliases for Active and Alumni positions will be created. Examples of aliases are Pres@, AlumniSecretary@, and Postmaster@SigPhi.ca. Again, any reasonable alias will be considered.

This server will not be a POP access server; it will only forward mail in an effort to reduce hardware costs. Thus, the user will be responsible for keeping the mail sysop informed of a valid email address that the mail will be forwarded to. Forwarding addresses can be updated by using the automated mail server code (instructions will be mailed when you sign up) or by mailing the mail sysop at Postmaster@SigPhi.ca.

(disclaimer) We cannot be responsible for mail that goes through this server; we will do our best to keep the service running in a timely manner, but the very nature of the House pretty much guarantees down time (though there will be a backup server running off site). It's best to keep these addresses for casual personal use and for Fraternity business.

The domain and dynamic IP handling was purchased and donated by Justin Malcolm; the hardware for the server was donated by Kevin Deane-Freeman. Server installation, backup mail service and account administration will be handled by Jeff Breadner. Internet access will be provided by the House.

Recently, not much has been happening on the correspondence front. The only major thing of note was the receipt of a series of General Convention Ballots to deal with issues spanning from streamlining of the Fraternity, to inclusion of non-North American institutions. These ballots have been submitted, and the results are as follows:

Expand the Fraternity beyond North America: Aye 21 Nay 2 Ouestion Passed

Change qualifications of Board of Trustee members: Aye 21 Nay 2 Question Passed Accept the Petition for Charter from the students at Bangladesh University of Engineering Technology: Aye 19 Nay 4 Ouestion Passed

Amend the Statutory Code to streamline Fraternity Organization: Aye 19 Nay 4 Question Passed

<u>Choosing a design for a Fraternity Logo:</u> Design #1 – 8 Design #2 – 2 Neither – 6 No Vote – 7 Question failed – neither design received a majority.

In terms of the membership database, the National Executive Director, Brother Bob Featheringham, has been trying to locate lost Brothers.
