This does not cover incidents that result in injury to Active Members due to accident or through the actions of other Active Members.

Through the generosity of a few, we have always been able to scrape by, but if a few more of a large number of members could see fit to donate even a little amount, we would not have to continue to rely on the same few, year after year. There is a return form included in this newsletter, and we also take any amounts you see fit at the Christmas Social each year. For those who receive the campaign notices from National, you are also able to allocate part of your donation to National to the local alumni chapter.
